our history and role

AGLP was founded in 1978, but has its roots in the advocacy of psychiatrists and advocates like John Fryer and Barbara Gittings who, in 1973, forged the discussion to depathologize homosexuality. The group began as a Caucus of the American Psychiatric Association (APA), and in 1985, AGLP became a separate organization allied with the APA, lending a much-needed voice to advocate for LGBTQ patient rights and access.

Through our own symposia and workshops at the annual meetings of the APA, our scientific journal, website, and through our liaisons with several psychiatric specialty groups, AGLP has maintained its important role of educating and advocating for the issues relevant to LGBTQ mental health. As an organization allied with, but separate from APA, AGLP is able to undertake projects and positions independent from APA. Our annual awards program recognizes and honors individuals and community organizations who share our goals.

Formerly The Association of Gay and Lesbian Psychiatrists, the association changed its name in 2015 to simply, AGLP, to make way for more inclusive definitions of our mission and role in the LGBTQ Community.
